President's Foreword



Pony Club Members and Supporters

I present my annual report for the year 2004 for the Pony Club Association of Victoria.

Insurance

Insurance remains an item of concern for many Pony Club members and supporters. This year the APCC has renewed the policy with last year's insurers with a substantial saving in premium, but without losing any benefits. Details of the policies are available on the PCAV website. James Fitzpatrick, the PCAV Executive Officer is also visiting every Zone to explain the details and answer questions.

Healthy and Welcoming Clubs

This initiative, sponsored by Vic Health, is aimed at helping Clubs provide a healthy and welcoming environment so that their members obtain the maximum benefit from their Pony Club involvement. Participation in the scheme is entirely voluntary and is self assessed. The Council strongly endorses this programme and urges Clubs to take part. Suanne Waugh is introducing the programme at Zone meetings.

Uniforms

The new uniform programme is now under way, giving Clubs and their members a range of new and traditional clothes to wear at official Pony Club activities.

Changes to the Rules of Incorporation

The informal vote on the proposed changes to the Rules has been strongly in favour of all three motions. Council is now having the wording for the changes prepared for insertion into the Constitution. When this is complete, clubs will receive copies of the revised Constitution and a Special General Meeting will be called for a formal vote on the changes. Clubs will be able to vote by proxy.

Treasurer

Ian Wardell, who has been Treasurer of PCAV for the last eleven years, resigned from the position in March, due to ill health. Ian has been a wonderful support for the Council and the office and his cheery presence will be missed. We wish him well. Council has now appointed Janice Ray to the position. Janice has a wealth of accounting experience and will ensure that PCAV's finances remain in their current healthy condition.

Activities

Ellyse Davis represented PCAV in the Australian National Mounted Games team that competed in Toronto in August 2003.

The Victorian team competed at the National Prince Phillip Games held in Tasmania in September 2003.

The Senior Mounted Games team took part in an invitation competition with NSW and a US team in Sydney in October.

The Council thanks the Mounted Games Committee for their enthusiasm and dedication in facilitating the training for and participation in all the national and international games competitions.

Thanks also go to Midland Zone for the State Dressage and Showjumping Championships and to Central Zone for the State Horse Trials Championships.

A new event last year was the Zone Teams Horse Trials that grew out of the previous year's support event for the Inter Pacific competition. The organising committee was gratified by the enthusiasm the event generated and it will be run again in the coming year. The Council's thanks go to the committee.

My thanks go to the Council for their support and dedication in what has been a busy year, to James Fitzpatrick and the staff in the PCAV office and to Clare Lewin and the CIP for their hard work. The members of the Executive have had a particularly busy time and deserve a special thank you.

Finally as always, my thanks go to you, the Pony Club members, supporters and volunteers who make Pony Club what I believe to be one of the best youth organisations in Australia.

Executive Officer

There were many highlights for the 2003-2004 year and it was pleasing to see the organisation take a number of steps in a very positive direction.

The development of a Business Plan, Budget, Performance Indicators, Risk Management Plan and new State Council Agenda Formats all led for a clearer direction for the State Council and the staff. The outcomes were measured and at the end of the year we have used this data to plan the coming year.

The strong membership growth was reflected in a sound financial result. Membership rose by 6% which was a very good indicator as to the strength and interest in pony clubs.

The first year of the three year government grants from Vichealth and the Department of Sport and Recreation were a tremendous boost to the association.

We have developed a new Healthy and Welcoming Clubs program aimed at assisting the clubs to review current practices to ensure the pony club experience is both healthy and welcoming for all individuals. A great resource manual is almost complete to assist clubs in the day-to-day management of their clubs.

The PCAV purchased new equipment to assist with our communication. This has helped with the new Making a Difference Newsletter and booklets from the office. We also undertook a Risk Management Plan for the State and we are developing a club risk management plan to be released in late 2004. We have taken steps to improve the database for membership and events and developed a completely new system. We gathered much information over the year so that the release of the new systems will have useful data.

The staff remained steady through the year with no staff changes making a more educated skilled team. Thanks to Suanne Waugh, Georgia Appleton, Jennifer Goard and Clare Lewin for their effort and enthusiasm in many improvements this year.

One of the highlights for the year was the quicker processing of Strength Returns and all clubs received their cards in July.

The financial result was pleasing as the trading shop, events, membership income all contributed to a good result. We managed to set aside some funds for 2004-2005 for insurance excesses, and for more training in zones such as first aid.

The introduction of two new events being Equitana Showjumping and the Zone teams Challenge increased participation at all levels.

Membership Cards have been reviewed and minor improvements will be seen on the 2004-2005 cards.

Some of the major rule changes included the introduction of a new uniform for riders, new helmet standards, and a new first aid policy.

The next year looks really positive as we continue on the journey of improvement. Major projects for the year are a redesign of the website including the membership database accessible by secretaries, the launch and rollout of the new uniform, all rules available on the website, the redesign of the newsletter with the inclusion of Zone information, the club resource kit, a club risk management plan, a new zone training format including first aid. We are sending a team to the Nationals in WA in July 2005 and will continue to focus and build on our events.

I wish to thank the State Council, Staff and members for their support over the year as they have all assisted in making my first year at PCAV enjoyable.

This year seems to have been one for change and review.

We have a new Uniform strategy that includes less formal Rally attire as well as new items of clothing for competition. There is also scope for Clubs to make their Uniform unique by

adding their own logo. This year for the first time riders of all ages wear long boots or gaiters for competition. As of January 2005 approved helmets will include the current AS/NZS 3838 as well as the EN 1384 and ASTM F1163. These are in line with the Australian Horse Industry Code of practice.

All of these changes will allow Pony Club riders a greater choice and be less restrictive.

The Dressage book is currently under review. This will be in the field by February 2005 and will include some new tests at each level. Writing Dressage tests is a very difficult task. There must be an even progression of skills tested at each level as well the correct balance of challenge and reward for horse and rider. A big thank you must go to Marie Gahan and Debbie Warne for their expertise in this area.

The Australian Pony Club Council's Syllabus of Instruction is also under review. The APCC Coaching panel is looking at the Syllabus as a whole, making sure each Certificate is standardised and follows on from the next. Guidelines are being produced for each task to help Coaches, riders and assessors interpret the requirements. The time frame for this is also 2005.

A National Coaching Accreditation Scheme pony Club Level 2 Syllabus is in the very early stages of development. A small grant was made available to the APCC from the Australian sports Commission with the instruction that work begin by June 30 2004. Rebecca Layton has been assigned by them to help with the documentation. Sue Chandler, the APCC National Coach, and I are working with Rebecca

using the guidelines developed at the APCC Coaching meeting in November 2003.

PCAV has now held two Clinics conducted by the APCC National Coach Sue Chandler. They were well attended and enjoyed by all. Sue has a wealth of knowledge and is able to impart it in a very organised non-confronting way that can be interpreted by Coaches at all levels.

The National Coaching Accreditation Scheme Pony Club Level 1 course continues to be well attended. PCAV produces a steady stream of new Coaches each year and those already in the field regularly fulfil their updating requirements to remain accredited with the NCAS. Currently we have 90 Coaches on our list.

Comfort and Safety workshops continue to be popular with one held at Bairnsdale in August 03 and one at Bendigo in June this year. Each participant is given a copy of the Gear Check Guidelines and other Course notes for reference. Explaining the reason for the rules has made it much easier to understand why the rules exist. Pam Davey, Master Saddler, provides an in depth look at saddle construction and fitting that is very educational and dispels many myths. Horseland Lilydale continues to supply items of saddlery for demonstration, their ongoing support for these Clinics is greatly appreciated.

Finally, I would like to thank the Chief Instructor's Panel for their work at State and Zone level and Council for their continued support.

The biannual ABK Clinic was held by Barwon Zone in early 2004.

So far this 2003 – 2004 year, approximately 50 riders have been examined and achieved certificates. All these riders are a credit to their Clubs, the co-ordinators and the examining panel.

Barwon Zone were pleased to nominate the following members for the Award of Merit, Stacey Mathieson from Ballan PC, Danielle Clayton from Ballarat PC and Dionne Smith from Bacchus Marsh PC.

Congratulations to you all.

The new Zone Executive took over in August 2003, with Norm Glenn taking over the role of President and Glenda Perry continuing to provide her expertise as Vice President. Peter Rodaughan returned as Treasurer to complement our continuing Secretary Barb Richards and Chief Instructor Wendy Abey. Completing the team was Fran Hartz who became Event Secretary in August 2003 and Karen Butler who took up the role of Examining Secretary in February 2004.

During the year, there was an increase in Riding and Associate Members of 26 or 3%, bringing the total to 934. This increase is a welcome change on the 10% reduction experienced last year.

Activity within the Zone continues to rise, with something happening almost every week at either club or zone level – adding to this is the excitement of the State events and the excellent participation levels. Still, a note of caution needs to be expressed, as a number of smaller clubs struggle to provide the necessary manpower to run an event as effectively as possible.

At State level, Central Zone riders competed with courage and flair and achieved a degree of success. The well run Dressage and Showjumping Championships held at Avoca saw our Grade 2 Dressage Team achieve 1st place and the Grade 3 Dressage Team achieved 2nd place. The State Horse Trials held at Werribee draw limited participation by Central Zone but some success was achieved in Grade 2 where Nicole Hughes placed 3rd in her section and Sarah French 4th in her section. The State Games and Flat Teams Competition placed Riddells Creek No. 2 team at equal sixth in the Flat Team, whilst in the Musical Ride, Kilmore was placed 5th and Glenlyon and Macedon equal 6th. In the Games competition, Macedon won the day after a thrilling run off for 1st place. Finally, the inaugural Zone Teams Challenge Shield in Eventing for grade 3 and 4 was won by Central Zone.

The State Horse Trials were organized by Central Zone and were held on 1 & 2 May 2004 at Werribee. There were over 120 people actively involved in the running of the event, but special thanks must go to Norm Glenn, Glenda Perry, Wayne Cuthbert and Kevin Watson. Norm was inspired in the clever organising of the many volunteers and steadfastly cheerful in the face of some torment. Glenda's hand-made show bags for the riders were keenly sought after and her organisation of the entries was undertaken at her usual excellent standard. Wayne and Kevin made sure that the cross-country day was one to be remembered for all the right reasons. Lots of happy faces and helpful people on Sunday made it a weekend of good memories.

Another event of some note was the Central Zone Dressage Day that was held at Werribee in conjunction with the EFA Dressage Championships in April. It is hoped that this will continue as an annual event, providing an excellent fund raiser for the Zone. Glenda Perry again provided the impetus and expertise to organize the event, with Barb Richards and Norm Glenn providing able assistance.

Our Zone Chief Instructor, Wendy Abey, has again put together a wide ranging, technical programme for riders, DC's, parents and instructors during the year. In particular, the organisation of showjumping clinics with Jamie Murray and Alan Mitchell and showjumping Course Design with Jenny Muir was outstanding. During the year, in excess of 110 riders from over 16 clubs have completed their "C" standard certificate and the number of "K" candidates is on the rise.

On a personal note, the fulfillment of my role as Zone Representative has been, at times, both a challenging and confronting one. At one end of the spectrum is the shared joy evident in the successful completion of a particular challenge by our riders and the personal growth that flows from that; at the other is the growing group of adult supporters who berate, intimidate or challenge PCAV officials, organisers and helpers and in the process, provide exactly the wrong example to riders.

My thanks to all in Central Zone who contributed to our efforts this year – especially to the delegate members of the Zone Committee of Management whose understanding and commitment made my tasks so much easier.

She celebrated her 21st birthday in style winning the Narracorte Young Rider 3 Day the following week, a great effort. Another good effort was Jessica Mills placing 1st in "PA" Grade Show Jumping at Equitana 2003 and 2nd in "PA" show jumping at the State Championships. Other pleasing results were Ellie Jacks 3rd in Grade 1 dressage and our 'PB' Grade show jumping and Grade 2 dressage teams both placing. At the State Games and Flat Championships we had riders in all events. Over a hundred guests watched as Phylliss Broadwood was presented with a certificate of appreciation for running the catering at all the State Championships run in our Zone, four in all.

Miss Francis Corry, Nathalia and Mrs. Dorothy Miles, Kyabram, both District Commissioners were awarded Life Memberships of the Zone for all the work they have done for the Zone. Mr. George Hare, an outstanding member of our Zone cut the birthday cake.

Norelle Bond, our chief instructor has been busy running three instructional clinics at Cobram, Swan Hill and Bunbartha. All well attended; there are two more coming up – Balranald and Denilquin. Norelle has been writing a very interesting newsletter with the minutes.

Bev Parsons, our Zone Examining Secretary has been busy getting certificates passed all the year- 33 members. We have two members nominated for Award of Merit – Alexis Fehring, Cohuna and Lincoln Spears, Echuca.

Our members rode in terrible weather conditions, hot and windy at Avoca in February State Dressage Showjumping Championships, placing 5th in grade 3 dressage and 6th in C grade showjumping; Eliza Balding winning the C grade Showjumping at Equitana and for the other families who went down to compete and spectate and observe some wonderful things throughout the displays and demonstrations.

At Werribee in May we had 8 riders for the Horse Trials State Championships, our biggest entry for a long time. Back to Werribee again for the Zone Challenge in grades 3 and 1 Eventing, we only had one team in each grade instead of 3, but I'm sure they enjoyed meeting people from other parts of the Zone and around the state.

Then in June off to Geelong for the Flat Teams Musical Ride. Deniliquin, and Barham Koondrook were competing. On Sunday Barham Koondrook (who had their whole club competing minus one rider), Rochester and Mildura for the games. Good close races with Rochester winning one heat, not often done by our Zone.

Five riders went to the ABK weekend at Smythesdale. Our Zone is in three groups; one group had 3 jumping schools with Alan Mitchell. Won the best newcomers tent at the Swan Hill Field days – with 5 clubs exhibiting articles and exhibits along with the harness club and polocrosse club. Another group had Sally Francis instructing for the weekend, also Ken Folmeringham doing showjumping and a practice games day at Finley.

One group has 62 riders for a long weekend camp at Balranald, with a host of activities.

The Zone has a camp at Barmah in September and other clubs have their own camps.

The most difficult aspect of 2003/2004 year for Wannon Zone was finding a spare date for clubs to run their fund-raising competitions. While we try to keep the first Sunday sacrosanct for rallies there are pressures on clubs in small communities to fit in with local festivities and other sporting fixtures in their area. In grade one, most riders ie 35 riders or 76% had no faults in cross country but only 8 riders or 17% navigated the show jumping course without fault. In grade two, just less than half ie 62 riders or 44% had faults in cross country and 102 riders or 74% had faults in showjumping. The challenges were appropriate for the level of competition and most riders will use the experience gained to see the way forward for further improvement.

The Safety and Gear Check was satisfactory, however, a couple of saddles were only marginally acceptable and would need re-stuffing in the very near future and, at the Games Gear Check some reins were too short. Following the lunch break a number of girths were not properly tightened and as this could prove dangerous it is important that Team Managers make sure all gear is fitted properly.

Flat Teams State Championships

A total of 24 Flat Teams competed for the Championship title. First place was awarded to Yarrambat Pony Club (North Metropolitan Zone) with a total of 226 points out of a possible 280 points. It was apparent from all the Teams performances that all had worked long and hard to achieve the standards exhibited. Eight of the Flat Teams also competed in the Musical Ride Teams Section.

Musical Ride Teams State Championships

A total of 24 Musical Ride Teams competed this year. First Place was awarded to Cockatoo Pony Club (West Gippsland Zone) with a total score of 86 points out of a possible 100 points. This event attracts more teams and spectators every year and, the Judge, Mrs Margaret Foy, requested that her congratulations be passed on to all the riders for the amount of thought, time and effort every participating member put into their ride. Once again, the high standard of choreography, music and enhancement shown by all teams was delightful to watch.

Kay Irving Memorial State Games Teams Championships

25 Teams competed against each other for the Kay Irving Trophy. Following the last game Macedon Pony Club (Central Zone) and Yarrambat Pony Club (North Metropolitan Zone) were equal with 290 points out of a possible 300 points, however, after a ride-off, 1st place was awarded to Macedon Pony Club. As always the enthusiasm and determination of the Games Teams created an exciting atmosphere for both spectators and participants. A big thank-you to all the Lane Judges who were all experienced and did a good job. It was a long, cold day and we appreciate their assistance. Special thanks also to Mr Graham Last who did an excellent job as Broadcaster coming in as an emergency for our regular expert Mr Mike Gorman who had to withdraw at the last minute due to illness.

Serious Incident at the Games Day:

The Games Day was marred by the response of an individual and some supporters following a Judging decision and a subsequent Jury of Appeal decision. Abuse of judges and officials is unacceptable behaviour and this incident spoiled the enjoyment of the day for a number of our volunteers and officials. Indeed the incident has caused some to question their future involvement and the incident diminishes the championships as a pleasurable sporting event.

We, the State Games, Flat and Musical Ride Teams Committee, would like to congratulate all the riders (and their horses) who competed in the above events. In general the team spirit and enthusiasm over the weekend is a credit to all the clubs and we look forward to their participation in future championships. Special thanks to all our hard working volunteers, without whose assistance and support this weekend would not be possible.

Zone Teams Challenge

Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre

22nd – 23rd May 2004

The PCAV Zone Teams Challenge Horse Trials for Grades 3 & 4 riders held at Werribee Park on the fourth weekend in May was inspired by the success of the Grade 3 teams event held in conjunction with the Inter Pacific Rally ODE hosted by Victoria the previous year.

I believe the Pony Club movement manages Horse Trials for very young riders better than any other organization. With this in mind we aimed to provide the opportunities for more of our members to be involved in Horse Trials at State Level. While many dedicated young riders move up the grading ranks and are ultimately able to ride at the Grade 1 & 2 State Championships there are a larger proportion of members, who, for a variety of reasons such as commitment to tertiary studies, work or career opportunities that take them away from home, or merely the lack of a suitable horse or parental support will never attain this level.

To broaden the State level Horse Trials to include lower grades is to challenge many more young riders and their great, all-round ponies at the highest possible level of their achievement in their favourite horse sport. For many who participated in this years event it was the highlight of their pony club year. Some will be inspired to go on and others will always have great memories of the weekend they rode at Werribee.

An essential objective for this event was the promotion of sportsmanship and positive social interaction between clubs and zones which is why we chose to run it as a 'teams only' event. Recommendations to selectors were that their teams should be evenly matched and made up with members from different clubs where possible, with the ultimate challenge trophy going to the zone with the highest aggregate score of team placings. Congratulations to Central Zone for their win this year.

The weekend was organized around the expectation of 30 teams of 4 riders in each grade competing in the three phases of dressage, cross-country and showjumping – a total of 240 competitors. In the final count we had 24 zone teams in each grade with an extra 6 composite or mixed teams with riders from reserve lists of different zones in Grade 3 and another 5 composite teams in Grade 4, some with only three riders – approximately 235 riders entered with very few scratchings recorded prior to the event.

In addition to the riding participants each zone was required to provide volunteer manpower to run the event. While dressage judges, showjumping judges and course designers were arranged prior to the event we were very reliant upon parents and friends of competitors to make up the manpower needed throughout the event. As one of the strengths of Pony Club is its volunteer workers, with the help of Norm Glenn as co-ordinator of the volunteers, the programme ran amazingly smoothly, so thanks to all those who helped in any capacity, your efforts were very much appreciated.

Thank you also to the members of the subcommittee who planned this very successful weekend. From the many favourable comments received from parents and riders and pony club personnel the Zone Teams Challenge Horse Trials for Grades 3 & 4 will continue to have its place on the calendar.
